

Grapevine Nature Notes February 2010

This has been a long hard winterand it looks as though we are not out of the woods yet! As I write we are having flurries of that white stuff again and we have all had enough of it.

One good thing about snow, apart from the tobogganing, is that you can see what has been going on in your garden and elsewhere by the tracks left, and very interesting they can be. For instance, the rabbits are more numerous in Church Wood than I thought and the deer have been very grateful for the carrot peelings that I leave in the wood when it is so very cold.

Needless to say I almost need to take out a mortgage to feed the birds, but the numbers and varieties have made everything worth while and I am going to make no apologies for showing Geoff and Angela Painting's bird list, because it is just amazing. (They probably need a mortgage too) Here goes:

Wren, Starling, Jackdaw, Siskin, Chaffinch, Three different Thrushes, Blue Tit, Great Tit, Willow/ Marsh Tit, Long Tail Tit, Goldfinch, Blackbird, Robin, House Sparrow, Dunnock, Wood Pigeon, Collared Dove, Magpie, Reed Bunting, Pied Wagtail. I think that is just fantastic and for my garden I can add the Jay and ,much to my surprise, a male Black-cap. This must have over wintered here and I bet it is regretting the decision.

Despite all the cold it is wonderful to hear the spring calls of blue tits and chaffinches and especially the song thrush. I also see growing interest in my bird boxes. The black-birds have been stating their claim on territory and females too which is very encouraging.

By the time you read this let us hope that it is warmer and the wild life is really getting into the swim of spring activity. I have lost some frogs in the frozen pond but I hope there are enough survivors to produce the annual display of fighting, squirming heaps of them and the resultant tadpoles to keep us all amused.

Can we all listen out for the cuckoo and record the date.....let me know.

Open Gardens 2010 What you Need to Know now!

On Sunday 27th June 12.30pm to 5.30pm Stockcross will be inviting visitors to view several private gardens within the village.

The church will be open and will hold a flower display, make it's parish Records available to view and have a local history exhibition.

At the village Hall members of the Newbury Symphony Orchestra will play as people are enjoying afternoon tea and cakes, there will be an exhibition of local artists and photographers work, together with stalls selling plants, produce and second-hand books.

As well as, we hope, being a pleasant afternoon we are raising funds for three different local charities The Friends of Newbury Hospital, St John's Church, Stockcross and The Sutton Hall.

Entrance to the gardens will cost £3.50 per person (children free) for which they will get a map showing the suggested route to find all the open gardens etc. Parking will be on the Glebe Field courtesy of Sue & Edward Vandyk. Sue is kindly co-ordinating the working party for the overall event.

To make the afternoon a success we are initially asking people to get involved by planning ahead. Nearer the date we will call for helpers on the actual day too.

What to Grow for the Plant Stall -suggested by Meri Mower head Gardener Stockcross House.

Quality rather than quantity is the by-word. Make sure pots are well filled and well labelled. Grow whatever you have in abundance and can easily divide for example:

- Alchemilla mollis
- Campanulas
- Geraniums
- Daisies

Don't worry if it is very common - buyers are often just starting out gardening. Divide in early spring and they will be well established in the pots.

Late Summer perennials - these will look fresh and ready to go:

- Helianthemums
- Penstemons
- Phlox

Bulbs/Corms - will sell well

- Dahlias
- Lilies
- Crocosmia

The end of June is a bit late for most annuals but if you plant them late buyers would welcome: Sweet peas, Nicotiana, Sunflowers, Vegetable plants
