





O you know about the history of where you live? Maybe you are new to the area or having lived here for many years would like to know more. In 'The Grapevine' area we have a local history group which has a mountain of information on their website.

The 1921 Census has just been released, and can be viewed at www.findmypast.co.uk Unfortunately there is a charge to view individual records. On our website: www.stockcrosshistory.org.uk we have transcribed all the census from 1841 through to 1911 and they certainly make interesting reading.

In the 1841, listed under occupations were agricultural labourers, builders, washerwomen, shoemakers, and papermakers as well as grocers, publicans and even a surgeon. Also listed were two Maltsters whose job is to extract malt from barley, which is the first stage of the brewing and distilling process. They had to slow down and manage the germination process, with the objective of providing exactly the right environment for converting starch into sugar.

In further census occupations listed were Keeper of Beer Shop and one listed as Beer Retailer and Police Sergeant. Our first Post Mistress Sarah Dyer was listed in 1861. She was still Post Mistress in 1881 census aged 79 and was still alive in 1891.

There are also records of the Stockcross Coal Club, Shoe Club and the Sutton Rent Book from 1918-1924 plus many more interesting articles.

Up to now most of these records were for S&SHA members only but at our recent AGM we all agreed to open up this information to the public. Hopefully this will encourage people to research further and maybe join our group.

The annual membership is £15 for an individual or £25 per couple. We meet on the 2nd Wednesday of the month in the Sutton Hall at 2pm. Guests are welcome at a cost of £5. Of course, if you are unable to join but would like to make a donation towards the club we would be most grateful.

On 20 January 2022, myself and Kerry Pfleger from RAW Planning Ltd presented Sir Richard Sutton Limited's first draft proposals for the development scheme of '71 & 72 Glebe Lane and Land adjoining to the East'. The draft scheme, subject to surveys, comprises the demolition of 71 & 72 Glebe Lane, facilitating an improved access for the site, and replacing the two existing Estate houses to accommodate ten new dwellings. The site proposes a mix of two, three and four-bedroom properties with car ports, bicycle and bin storage, and electric car charging points. In tandem with our proposals, and outside of the planning application, we are also to provide upgraded parking, storage and landscaping to our let properties at 62-66, & 75 Stockcross, while retaining the rear access rights for 68 Glebe Lane.

The presentation, held in Sutton Hall, Stockcross, was attended by over 30 individuals. The draft site proposals shown enabled us to gain initial feedback from those attending. The main comments and concerns heard were;

- Volume of traffic use and capacity for vehicle movements along Glebe Lane
- Site capacity and number of dwellings proposed
- Parking provision within the development site
- · Properties designed with energy performance and sustainability in mind
- Designs in-keeping with the setting and vernacular of existing village properties

Response to the above points will be provided as a direct result of further surveys of the site and planning policy at the time of submitting the planning application. With the view of submitting the application in late Spring/early Summer 2022, detailed surveys on traffic, drainage, ecology, arboriculture and utilities will take place over the coming weeks and months to gather site information before a final layout is designed.

Prior to our submission of the full planning application to West Berkshire Council we will circulate the final layout of the scheme via The Grapvine mailing list, and, following comments from attendees of the initial presentation, we will hold another local presentation to enable further comment on our more detailed proposal.

I would personally like to extend my thanks to those who attended and facilitated what we feel was a positive discussion regarding the site. Further updates will follow once we have more definitive site information.
