

#### INDEPENDENCE DAY MEETING FOR RISING SUN

Savetherisingsun.org has been invited to apply for a government match-funding grant from the Community Ownership Fund administered by the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC). The grant would contribute to half the purchase price, up to £50k refurbishment costs and £50k start-up costs. This was the good news presented on 4th July to members of the community who came to The Sutton Hall to learn about The Way Forward for The Rising Sun. The DLUHC also tells us "you have a high chance of being found eligible for the Fund". This was in addition to the equally good news that our offer of £400k, subject to community support, had been accepted by the Hayward family.

A lively discussion was held during the meeting whose attendees included members of Speen Parish Council and Lynne Docherty one of our ward councillors on, and leader of West Berks Council. Lynne expressed significant support and made useful suggestions during the discussions that carried on into the "Pop-Up Bar" afterwards.

Perhaps more than the 30 people present would have come to the meeting had it been stressed beforehand that no-one was going to be asked for money that evening. We emphasised that the presentation was not a financial promotion. An essential message from the meeting was that The Rising Sun would not be owned by any individual or small group.

It is now the task of the board of savetherisingsun.org Ltd to apply for the grant by 19th August when the application window closes. The submission will include a business plan and evidence of how the grant will be matched. At the moment this is uncertain, as there are still many unknowns as to what will be acceptable to the DLUHC. However, we are encouraged not just by the invitation letter to apply but that during the first phase of the COF (this is the second phase) several pubs were awarded grants. We remain open to ideas and suggestions – just let us know via the contact details below.

Hard copies of the presentation have been distributed around the community and digital copies sent to the approximately 70 members of savetherisingsun.org. ### Hall financial update

We have just finished the 2021/22 financial year and I am pleased to report that trading has returned to more normal levels with a surplus being made from trading rather than business support grants from the government! We have been helped that to date we have not been impacted by electricity increases although that challenge is ahead of us in 2023.

The positive trading position has allowed us to let the various village community groups continue to use the hall free of charge , retain the heavy discounts for villagers who wish to hire the hall and maintain the low hiring rates which haven't been reviewed for some years . Regrettably the hiring rates will doubtless have to be increased into 2023 to help with power costs but we cross that bridge when we get to it and know the extent of the challenge .

Over the last couple of years the hall has built up considerable financial reserves through the receipt of government business support grants, generous donations and large running cost savings due to being closed in the lockdowns. As we headed out of the pandemic led restrictions the committee decided to reinvest substantially in the hall. The new kitchen is complete, in August we are having a new heating system installed & a new hearing loop put in. Over the Christmas period we plan a complete redecoration.

Full facts & figures will be presented at the AGM - come along if only for the cheese & wine! October 26th, 7.30 for 8pm in the small hall.

This time we are sampling 125ml of each of 5 delicious red wines




from South Africa and the same volume of my favourite Port. In addition there will be 5 different cheeses to try, biscuits for cheese and, of course, chocolate to go with the Port.

### **B4000 PAVEMENT UPDATE**

28<sup>th</sup> On June Speen Parish Councillors Alan Booth,
Anthony Newell-Hart and Keith Phillips held an onsite meeting with Neil Stacey and David Wildish of
West Berks Highways. It appears that the Department for Transport, who have awarded the £280,000
for the footpath are expecting the pavement to be
wide enough to facilitate pedestrians and cyclists.

This is perhaps a requirement more appropriate for
an urban rather than rural environment. We believe
this is unlikely to be attractive, nor indeed feasible
for the racing cyclists who tear up and down the
B4000 but would be so for more leisurely cyclists.
We all agreed that by far the primary need is for pedestrians.

The route will be along the north side verge, to enable easy access from residential and business properties along the route and to minimise the need to cross the carriageway. It will be mostly adjacent to the carriageway, and be protected by a concrete kerb.

The next stage is for WB Highways to determine the timescale with the DfT. The work will be undertaken in sections and is not expected to begin until late autumn at the earliest.
