




Stockcross Starts It's Summer Holiday Early

START OF THE PAVEMENT MEANS END OF THE ROAD

As soon as the first sod is turned for the B4000 pavement (see separate article) I will hang up my councillor's hat after more than 14 years in the role. There will then be no-one on Speen Parish Council from within the Stockcross village envelope. Indeed, of the nine other current councillors only Alan Booth, who has played a major role in driving the Pavement Project, lives our side of the by-pass. Stockcross and the immediate surrounding area is a very different environment from the more urban side of the A34. The council really does need at least one person "on the ground" to represent our interests.

The role is not onerous. Much of the "heavy lifting" is done in committee or by working party. The establishment is 13 so there is room for four more without an election. Clearly, sharing the role will make the job much easier and help ensure that at least someone from Stockcross will be attending meetings. So come on, what about it?! Like any good project, planning for the village panto starts early. We're currently looking at scripts and will make a decision soon.


Anyone from the village and surrounding area is welcome – no previous experience needed though a sense of humour helps. Age and ability don't matter – all are welcome to have a go and there are many

New Councillors update for Stockcross community:

We, Antony Amirtharaj and Martha Vickers, are your new councillors for Stockeross. We are passionate about our village and committed to serve this community by listening to the people of our village in order to make progress. We want to hear your concerns and your ideas. We want to work with you to make our village a better place.

One of our top priorities is to finish the Stockcross to A4 shared path project. This project will create a safe and accessible footpath between from the rest of Newbury/Speen through A4 to Stockcross village. The project is in design stage (Design shared for review) and we hope to get this commenced and completed as per the targeted timelines.

We also share the concern about the future of the Rising Sun pub. The pub is a beloved community asset, and we want to do everything we can to keep it open. We will be working with the pub's owners and the council to explore options for keeping the pub afloat.

Unfortunately, the post office had to close but we'll monitor demand for a new facility and will actively pursue the option of reopening the post office based on the demand.

We will be also doing regular surgeries focussed on Stockcross with the first surgery proposed on 22nd September Friday at the Post Office 12 to 2 PM and we plan to conduct this surgery every three months.

Dear Sir/Madam,

Highway works - Stockcross Active Travel Path scheme

I write to inform you that West Berkshire Council intends to carry out works on the public Highway on the north side of the B4000 Ermin Street, between the A4 roundabout and the centre of Stockcross village, opposite Stockcross Post Office.

The purpose of the works is to construct a shared path, for use by pedestrians and cyclists, parallel to the B4000 between the village and the A4. This scheme will use funding assigned by the Government, for Active Travel.

The works will take place on the Highway and will involve:

- Reconstruction and widening of short existing sections of footway near to the A4 roundabout;
- Construction of a shared path for use by pedestrians and cyclists, parallel to the B4000 on its north side between the A4 roundabout and a point opposite Stockcross Post Office, including provision of marked crossings at the side turning that serves Rookswood, Chapel Lane and Snake Lane, and at other accesses;
- Alterations to the existing crossing immediately east of, Stockcross Post Office;
- Installation of raised kerbs at bus stops to assist with boarding and alighting from local buses, including at the main stops in Stockcross.

A set of plans showing the scheme is appended to this letter. Please note that this has been compressed to fit in the letter.

The works will be undertaken by our term contractor Volker Highways and are anticipated to start in late summer 2023. Further details on programming will be provided shortly.

The Stockcross Active Travel Path scheme is a first step in creating an offcarriageway route for walking, wheeling and cycling, between Stockcross village and the quiet road called Speen Lane that connects onwards into Newbury.

The Council will shortly be starting design work on the next section of the route, crossing the A4 and A34 towards Speen Lane, in anticipation of further funding becoming available in the near future for that section.

ASTRONOMY ARTICLE JUNE EDITION

June has the most daylight of any month and the longest day and shortest night. Although the days get shorter after midsummers day on 21st June, the thermal lag means the hottest days are still ahead of us. It's a good time to look out for the rarely seen Noctilucent clouds: long whispy clouds with a distinctive electric blue tint which are clouds being lit by the Sun while it's be-



low the horizon. These clouds are the highest of all clouds at around 80km and often hundreds or thousands of miles away from the observer. The best time to look for them is towards the North, 90 mins to 2 hours after the sunset, close to the horizon

This month the Constellations are harder to pick out due to the lighter sky, but Cassiopeia will still be visible in the north east around 11pm. You will find it half way between the Pole star and the horizon as a distinctive zigzag of bright stars. In mythology Cassiopeia was a vain queen who was punished by Poseidon for her wicked ways and forced to wheel around the Pole star forever. Saturn will be visible just above the Moon if you get up early and look towards the South around 4am on 10th June. Jupiter will be very close to the left of the Moon at

a similar time on 14th and both Mars and Venus are just below the Moon in the evening of 22nd June around 10pm.

Topic of the Month: Invisible light

Today we take for granted that visible light is just a small part of the electromagnetic spectrum and that lots of other types of light exist which we can't see with our eyes, such as microwave, infrared, radio waves and x rays. But years ago nothing was known about invisible light. The breakthrough came in the 1790's when William Herschel was splitting light using a prism. He was measuring the temperature of each colour and found that they indeed had different temperatures. Red and orange were warmer than

other wavelengths. But his extraordinary discovery was when he put his thermometer in the darkness beyond the red end of the spectrum and found the temperature was the highest of all, even though his eyes were telling him nothing was there. This was infrared light but we now know the whole spectrum is huge. If the all the visible light we can see, from blue to red, was spread out on the floor like a rainbow of colours and was one metre long, just the infrared section of the spectrum would be three kilometres long! There are a vast variety of invisible light waves out there. Infrared is especially useful for astronomers because it can be used to detect objects which aren't visible to our eyes. It's strange thinking that in space where it's hundreds of degrees below freezing dust and other objects are emitting light for the same reason as a red hot iron bar. Everything is glowing and that gives astronomers a mechanism to detect and study the universe.
