weather of a few weeks ago laid the groundwork for the endless sun of March to work its

Since I last wrote many of us enjoyed another Tony Hersh Wine Tasting Extravaganza. Once

again Tony selected a variety of wines for us to match to the notes and descriptions in a

quiz. Once again, I tried but failed to get them right (I blame the wine, the lovely cheeses and snacks and the great company). Concluding the night was a well-supported raffle.

These wine tasting evenings are great fun and very good fundraising events for the Hall.

The Hall Committee has been busy planning a few events as well. First is the VE Day

Luncheon at the Hall celebrating the 80 th anniversary. This will be on Monday 5 th of May.

There will be decorations, a display by SASHA of life in the village during the war, vintage

vehicles, music of the 40's and attendees are encouraged to wear outfits from that era – be

it as a land girl, soldier, spy, medic, farmer, Lumber Jill, cleric... All wishing to attend must

buy a ticket so seating and tables can be laid out beforehand. Bring your luncheon, plates

and cutlery. The Hall will supply a glass of bubbles with which to toast the occasion and will

run a bar to raise funds for the hall.

You see mention of raising funds for the hall a couple of times in this missive. Our normal

running and repair costs are usually met through our hiring to groups plus the Panto, wine

tastings and, until recently, running Pop Inn events. But with no pub in the village and the

fact that villagers want a place to gather together, a subgroup of our hall committee has

begun working on designs/plans/funding for a revamp of the small hall to make it look less a

classroom and more a cosy, inviting area for small gatherings, meetings, clubs and classes

and village get-togethers. Funding is being sought from charitable organisations but there

may be a need to raise funds in support of this.

Hanig forewarned you of future fundraising there are two other events coming up (non-fund

raising). First is a Pub Crawl. We are planning to reenact last year's pub crawl – Hare & Damp;

Hounds, Deanwood Golf Course, Vineyard and then back to the Sutton Hall. The date is

June 20 th . We need to know numbers attending so we can notify the venues. Tickets (\$5 per

person) will be available on Jumblebee. The ticket entitles walkers to a drink and a sausage

roll at the end of the walk at the hall. The other event is the Stockcross Rounder's Match – a

fiercely funny, hotly contested annual match. Never seen it or played rounders myself.

Astronomy of The Month: Dark Skies

We take it for granted that skies in the countryside will be dark and the stars will be beautiful and visible on dark nights. Unfortunately there is increasing amounts of light pollution at night that is negatively affecting astronomers views of the night sky and negatively affecting animals. Evidence summarised by Darksky.org details recent findings that light pollution affects noc-



turnal animals. Predators can't use darkness to hunt, amphibians are confused by the light and it affects their reproduction and even hatching turtles have been seen scrambling towards human made lights at night rather than towards the ocean. Artificial lights can make birds migrate too early and then miss ideal conditions for nesting, foraging and other behaviours. Many insects are drawn towards bright lights at night and there is even evidence that too much light at night increases the risk of obesity, depression and some cancers in humans. The Commission for Dark Skies (CfDS) was set up by concerned members of the British Astronomical Association in 1989 to raise awareness of the problem and campaign for switching off of floodlights and street lighting at night. There are lots of simple things individuals and councils can do from closing curtains at night to illuminating streets with street lights that direct the light only downwards. There is a free dark sky event happening in Hampstead Marshall Village Hall from 10.30am on Saturday 10th May open to everyone being run by CfDS. There will be a series of talks throughout the day related to this subject including by myself, exhibition stands and if it's clear, a chance to look through telescopes at the night sky that evening. 


WITH SION WHILEY & FRIENDS
