

THE SHOP: A Priority for the Sutton Estate

Around 70 people who attended an open discussion on 12 February in the Sutton Hall were relieved and encouraged to hear James Ingestre, local manager of Sutton Estates, state that the Estate's first priority is reinstating and improving the shop, both with respect to the layout and the offering.

James presented three op-

tions for the Estate:

- 1. Find a tenant for the shop, definitely with previous experience.
- 2. Offer it as a community-run operation James quoted examples where this has been a great success, with the community appointing a manager, and others which had been a total nightmare. A show of hands suggested there would be some difficulty finding sufficient volunteers to help run the shop, cp our experience in running the Sutton Hall!

Change the use and build a bungalow – James said this was definitely not a preferred option and it is certainly not that of the attendees.

Work has already begun on clearing vegetation, to make the site more attractive. Topics covered included:

- The Estate removing walls at the rear of the shop to give it greater depth and installing proper, attractive shelving.
- The Estate moving the house kitchen from its current location at the rear of the shop into the main body of the house to facilitate separating the house from the shop.
- James reported that in spite of the very low rent on the house (£700) many of the prospective shop tenants (none of whom were otherwise suitable no reasons given, nor asked for at the meeting) were not attracted to renting the house as they already had their own properties.
- James said permission would be sought for parking down the left side of the shop. There is already a driveway for parking several cars.
- Making the shop attractive not just to give residents an alternative to going down to the local corner stores or supermarkets but also to attract passing trade as well as residents of Newbury to use it, as many did when we had the post office.
- Ideas from the floor included offering newspapers, a delicatessen, Sutton Estate

produce (James concurred), coffee shop, small meeting facility, a bar of some sort, on-line delivery hub, get the post office back(!!)

- James would welcome a tenant applying for a licenced premises for evening opening.
- Although a very long shot, James said it would still be worth seeing whether / how they might be able to get the PO reinstated.

James acknowledged the huge support for the shop and admitted he was surprised by the large attendance.

In conclusion:

- 1. The estate's priority is to reestablish the shop
- 2. The estate remains open to suggestions and ideas
- 3. The estate will advertise for a new tenant when they are further along with proposals before they can go out to the market.
- 4. James and his team will prepare a plan to present to the Sutton board whose approval for the considerable financial investment will be required. James hopes to share the plans with residents either via email/link followed up by another meeting in the Sutton Hall.

James thinks it will be at least six months before the shop could reopen. The evening ended with an impromptu round of applause for James.
